Information for Parents/Carers: Agreement to complete Parent/Carer questionnaires BRIGHT: Brushing RemInder 4 Good oral HealTh

You may remember you recently received an information pack about BRIGHT, which is being run at your child's school. Your child has now agreed to take part in BRIGHT. We have included the Parent/Carer Information Sheet here again for your reference.

We want to find out about your child's dental health, so we are asking parents/carers if they would be willing to answer some questions too. We need you to let us know your address. We will then send a paper booklet in the post to you 4 times over 3 years. The questions will be about your child's teeth and any visits your child makes to the dentist - they will not be difficult to answer.

All parents/carers who complete the final questionnaire will be entered into a prize draw with the chance of winning £100 in vouchers.

If you are happy to complete the questionnaires, **please return the enclosed 'Parent/Carer Consent Form: Agreement to complete Parent/Carer questionnaires' in the freepost envelope provided.** If you decide to take part, you can always change your mind later on by contacting the research team (contact details are at the end of this sheet). If you decide not to take part, it will not change your child's involvement in BRIGHT.

If you agree to take part and provide your contact details, we may check with your child's school that these details are up to date when we send out questionnaires.

What will happen to the personal information collected in BRIGHT?

We will hold your name and contact details securely and confidentially at the York Trials Unit, University of York, in paper form and on password-protected databases. Only some members of the research team and data management team will have access to this information.

Personal information that identifies you or your child will be kept securely for fourteen years after the end of study (until the youngest person in the study is aged 25), after which it will be destroyed. Personal information that identifies you or your child will not be published or shared. Information collected by the research team may be shared with other researchers for research purposes only, but they will not be given your name or your child's name. If you want to know anything about the information we are storing about you, please contact the research team.

People from regulatory authorities, who check that research is being conducted well, may choose to check this project and will therefore see information about you and your child.

To help keep your child safe, we may need to let you and your child's school know if a response that your child provides raises concern.

We will use the information to help us see what reduces tooth decay in young people. We will write reports and tell people about the results of the research, so young people can get the help they need to look after their teeth. No one will be identified in any reports we write.
