21 hospitals were removed from the list (i.e. 9 were reclassified as small general hospitals because they had 24/7 cover; 6 had become registered care homes; 2 now functioned as hospices providing palliative care; 2 were now classified as mental health, 2 were specialist rehabilitation facilities), and 34 were added (10 rehabilitation and 24 other, i.e. 3 small general hospitals that no longer had 24/7 medical cover; 3 hospitals with activity coded mainly to geriatric psychiatric and 2 coded to adult mental health that had been traditionally viewed as community hospitals; 8 maternity hospitals (specialist) were deemed to be community hospitals; 8 hospitals were found to be wrongly classified as having 'no beds' on the HSCIC database.
