Information and consent

Participant background

- Professional role (if appropriate)
- Experience of delivery of family/group-based programmes or training in these approaches?
- How did you become involved in the E-PAtS programme?

Facilitator training

- Can you tell me about the training you received to become an E-PAtS facilitator?
- Aims of the E-PAtS programme?

Recruitment of participants to the E-PAtS programme / research study

- Can you tell me about how caregivers were recruited?
- Were you involved in recruitment? If so, how?
- Strengths/limitations of recruitment strategies in reaching: mothers/fathers?; families with differing levels of need?
- Acceptability of research design to: caregivers; facilitators; agencies/practitioners involved in recruitment?

Delivery of the E-PAtS programme sessions

- Can you tell me about your experience of delivering the E-PAtS sessions?
 - Experience of professional/caregiver co delivery
 - o Factors affecting achieving the correct number/mix of facilitators
- Delivery of activities
 - Factors affecting whether activities could be delivered as intended
 - o Adaptations made to the programme to meet participants' needs
- Response of care givers:
 - engagement in activities and intervention messages (including whether this differed for mothers/fathers)
 - o factors affecting attendance
 - o group dynamics and how these were managed
 - o key things which caregivers learnt during the programme

- Use of resources/workbook by caregivers and sharing with other family members
- potential impact of E-PAtS on caregivers and their families? Key processes?

Future plans / role of E-PatS within wider delivery systems

- Potential value of implementing E-PAtS in the future?
 - Distinctiveness/fit with existing services
 - Availability of other services? What is 'usual practice' in the facilitator's local area for families with children with intellectual disabilities?
 - Possible delivery systems/structures (e.g. who would deliver and fund the intervention)?
 - o Ways in which recruitment methods could be improved?
- Have you used parts of/techniques from E-PAtS in your other work / personal life?
